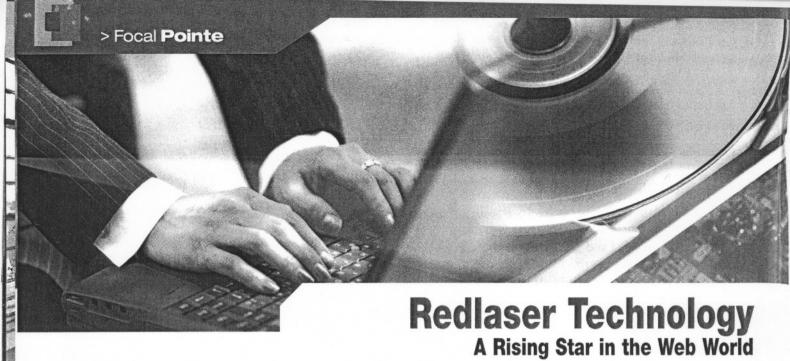

"We saw a need for a business that would develop web pages. A web page was going to be like someone's business plan. It is the invitation from your business to the customer. You take your business into their house."

It was that simple vision and foresight that Jackson State University graduates Adrian Jones and Moreh Smith had in 2002 that has catapulted them into successful business owners today. Redlaser Technology, Inc. is penetrating the web world with laser like speed.

The design firm, which offers Internet and web-related services to organizations throughout the United States, has seen its business increase by a whopping 300% in the last year. What started as a plan to survive a declining job market and hopefully gain job security for the next 5 to 10 years is now an ever changing road map that is embracing not only technology, but any new developments the future may hold. The company specializes in custom web design and programming.

Growing pains

Jones, Redlaser Technology's CEO and President, says it was the company's move into the Mississippi Technology Alliance's small business incubator, the Innovation Center, that put the business into overdrive.

"It was a hard road to get here. We started out in my mom's hallway then moved into JSU's computer lab. The problem there was that they would 're-do' the hard drive every night so if you didn't finish a project you had to start over the next day. We then moved into our first

actual office but it didn't have any air or heat so July made us move out of there. At our next office a recreational company moved in next door. We would be trying to hold a meeting and the walls would be shaking from the sound."

According to Jones, the move into the Innovation Center changed everything. "This facility has a corporate look and the product

speaks for itself. Once you get them in the environment the Center provides and give them the product with its high-end quality, it sells itself."

Unlikely pairing

It is no surprise that Jones, a Jackson native, majored in computer science. However, his partner, Moreh Smith followed a different path - biology. While Jones admits they are an unlikely pair, it is their shared passion for innovation and technology that is a recipe for success.

"Moreh attended a magnet school in Atlanta which placed a lot of focus on computer programming. We are both innovative thinkers. We pride ourselves on going above and beyond the expectations of our clients. Anybody can do pictures and text, we try to give a custom design and let the business speak through the website," says Jones.

Facing challenges head on

Jones admits he too is amazed that a company that had no clients three years ago can boast 235 today. Jones and Redlaser's other 4-5 employees work 12-18 hour days to handle the heavy workload. "Our biggest challenge is realizing we are human, learning to separate work from other stuff and find a balance in life."

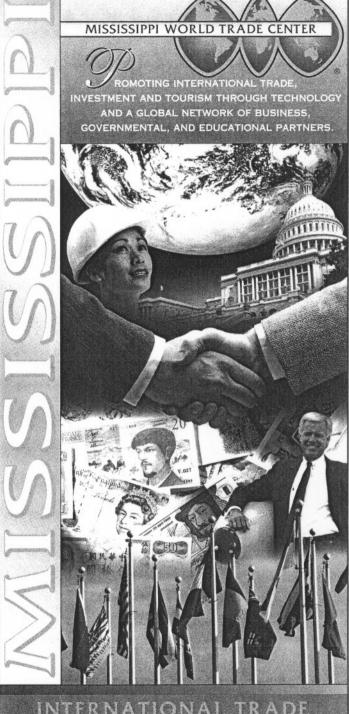
Embracing the future
